Holiday Outreach 2010

Thanks to WUMC's support, the Herbert Hoover Boy and Girls Club Adams Park Unit has been able to offer a variety of after school programs to over 1000 members. According to Nathan Ivy the site coordinator for the Adam Park Unit-"The Herbert Hoover Boys & Girls Club mission is to inspire and enable children six to eighteen to realize their full potential by becoming caring, productive, and responsible citizens. More specifically, the Adams Park Unit's role is to provide a safe and positive place for the youth in the surrounding area that includes the Botanical Heights, Shaw neighborhood, Forest Park Southeast. Having a safe and positive for them to come and enjoy various programs is important." The Boys and Girls Club of America provides children and teens with programs in five core areas: the arts, character and leadership, career and education, health and life skills and fitness and recreation. It's through programs like these that allow memebers to achieve their full potential.

Through a WUMC funded partnership MERS-Goodwill has implemented an employment assistance program that aims to train, place and retain FPSE and Botanical Heights residents into jobs. In 2010, MERS/Goodwill conducted 53 new client intakes, placed 57 area residents in jobs and provided 41 area residents with retention services. Classes fot he new Adult/GED program will begin February 1st, 2011 at the Herbert Hoover Boys and Girls Club Adams Park Units.









Grove Fest

On September 25, 2010 the Grove CID hosted Grove Fest 5. This year's Grove Fest was bigger and better than ever, with numerous street performers, 17 bands and DJ's, 22 food and retail vendors, a runway show, tattoo competition, and a 30 foot wide "Paint by Numbers" mural.

WUMC provided sponsorship as well as planning support for the event. In addition various WUMC staff members served on the Grove Fest planning committee.

Kim Yawitz, one of the co-chairs of the event stated, "Grove Fest has really become a featured event for the area. This year we had more attractions provided at the lowest budget ever. Neighborhood's businesses and institutions put a lot of time and energy in making this annual event a showcase of the area". The event has become so popular that Grove Fest proceeds will serve to support future Grove CID ventures.

Tour de Grove

In June, 2010 hundreds of cyclists zoomed through the Grove in the first annual Tour De Grove bike race. Athletes from all over the country braved the excruciatingly hot, humid and rainy conditions to participate in the day-long event filled with a 5K run, professional, amateur, and children's bicycle races, music and

entertainment. WUMC's support for the event provided funding for security patrol as well as event sponsorship in addition to event organizational support. WUMC staff also served on the planning and development committees. The Grove district and FPSE neighborhood were showcased as exciting, creative, and well-kept area. The Tour De Grove is the only race in the region on the prestigious USA Cycling National Racing Calendar (NRC). Next year's Tour De Grove will be held on Saturday, May 14th. Neighborhood Branding

After 2 years of planning which included design, engineering, fundraising, and approvals; a \$60,000, double-faced entry marker now spans Manchester Avenue marking the eastern entry to the area. The marker was installed on October 12, 2010 and measures 24ft wide by 9ft tall and is suspended 30 feet in the air. The

sign along with the neighborhood received a lot of positive press in the weeks that followed installation. WUMC's Brooks Goedeker served as the planning committees project manager. WUMC staff has also been played an active role in various neighborhood branding projects thought the Grove CID. The goal of the entry marker is to attract visitors to the area, as well as enhance the identity of the Grove as a diverse, appealing and pedestrian-friendly experience. The entry marker compliments the \$3.5 million streetscape enhancement that are currently underway on Manchester. The Grove CID contributed \$10,000 towards fabrication of the sign. Planning is currently underway for a second entry marker to be located at the Western entrance to the area.

Manchester Improvements January 2011

For the past few months, construction crews have been working on street improvements along Manchester Avenue. Old deteriorated sidewalks have been replaced with new wider pedestrian friendly sidewalks. Currently, all of the sidewalks along the north side of Manchester have been replaced and the south side is close to completion. In addition to the new sidewalks, crews have installed three new public art pedestals. Once sidewalk work is finished, construction crews will begin installing lighting and other pedestrian amenities. The project is aimed at increasing vehicular and pedestrian safety as well as strengthening district amenities. Work is expected to be completed by spring 2011. The new street scapes will help strengthen economic development along Manchester Avenue. WUMC continues to play a supportive role on the Manchester street improvements project.

- Widened sidewalks
- New ADA curb-cuts
- Countdown Pedestrian Signals
- Bump-outs at selected intersections
- Decreased from 4 lane road to 2 lane road
- New trash cans
- New bike racks
- New street trees
- New pedestrian lighting
- New shrubs
- Unique public art displays

WUMC is an active supporter of community safety for the FPSE and CWE neighborhoods. WUMC's efforts have provided funding and administrative support for these communities security patrols. WUMC actively monitors and documents crime statistics in the community. Additionally, WUMC works with agencies such as City's Finest and Securitas. 2010 was a great year for crime reduction in both neighborhoods. Overall crime as down 31.41% in the FPSE neighborhood and 15.7% in the CWE neighborhood.


