Introduction

THE NEIGHBORHOOD

The Skinker DeBaliviere neighborhood is located north of Forest Park with Lindell Avenue to the south, Delmar Boulevard to the north, the City limits just past Skinker Boulevard to the west and DeBaliviere Boulevard to the east. Surrounded by assets such as the vibrant and eclectic Delmar Loop- full of shops, restaurants, and entertainment- Forest Parkthe crown jewel of St. Louis parks- and the Washington University Danforth Campus, Skinker Debaliviere is one of the most sought after neighborhoods in St. Louis.

Developed around the time of the 1904 World's Fair in Forest Park as the city moved westward, Skinker DeBaliviere presents an array of historic and charming early 20th century single family homes, two family flats, and ornate apartment buildings which have been preserved by dedicated residents. The neighborhood flourished as a streetcar suburb in the early half of the 20th century with the Delmar streetcar and commercial district providing a "Main Street"-like environment with the community. Today, life in the community is active and connections among neighbors are strong, led by the proactive Skinker DeBaliviere Community Council, a nonprofit organized by residents since the 1960s to empower community involvement in decisionmaking in the neighborhood.













Jobs in Skinker DeBaliviere/ DeBaliviere Place by Sector, 2017










Red - Frequent: new high-frequency MetroBus routes operating every 15 minutes or faster during the day

Green – Local: new local MetroBus routes operating every 30 minutes during the day




In late 2019, Metro St. Louis introduced their redesigned transit maps for much of the St. Louis Area. This map reflects the changes.

Major Community Events

PortchFest - May

Community Assets

Skinker Debaliviere Community Council (SDCC)

SDCC formed in 1966 as a forum for neighbors to raise concerns, forge solutions, and address problems. The organization today performs a wide variety of functions, such as hosting a wide variety of events, improving public safety, welcoming new neighbors, and many more. In 2014, SDCC completed their Skinker DeBaliviere Urban Design & Development Plan.

Longevity is For Everyone (LIFE)

This free monthly workshop, sponsored by SDCC, targets senior citizens in the area. Each month, speakers focus on a topic of senior living. Previous months have focused on financial literacy, home improvement, and disaster preparedness. Some months are just for fun, such as ice cream socials.

Skinker DeBaliviere Community Housing Corporation

The Skinker DeBaliviere Community Housing Corporation is a sister organization to the Skinker DeBaliviere Community Council, focusing on the property development and management.

Lucier Park

Neighborhood Park located at Hamilton and Westminster and named for Phillip Lucier. (stl-mo.gov)

Grace United Methodist Church

Community church located in Skinker Debaliviere. The groups holds community ministries, support groups, and a weekly food pantry.

Regional Arts Commission of St. Louis

The Regional Arts Commission of St. Louis (RAC) is at the forefront of efforts to transform St. Louis into a more vibrant, creative, and economically thriving community by elevating the vitality, value, and visibility of the arts and culture. It is the largest annual funder of nonprofit arts in the region; and since its inception in 1985, has awarded more than 7,000 grants totaling over \$100 million to support individual artists, nonprofit arts and culture organizations, and other programs.







Development



1. Expo at Forest Park

285 apartments and 30,000 sf of retail is under construction on a former strip mall and parkand-ride lot. Once complete, the development will be one of the first transit-oriented developments in St. Louis. Investment: \$90 million Expected completion: 2022

2. Chelsea

A five-story mixed-use building is under construction on property previously used for surface parking. The project has been named Chelsea after the neighborhood in Manhattan.

Investment: Unknown Expected completion: early 2021

3. Walker Town Homes

Four town homes, each will feature 3 bedrooms, 4 bathrooms, ~2,200 sf and range in price from \$450k to \$485k. Investment: unknown Expected completion: 2021

4. Dorr and Zeller Building

Rehab of the Dorr and Zeller Building, home to Busey Bank, added 20 high-end apartments and 2,500 sf of additional ground floor retail. Investment: \$1.75 million Completion: 2019
