WELCOME TO FOUNTAIN PARK & LEWIS PLACE

During the 1890s, Lewis Place, a two-block street situated in North Central St. Louis between Taylor and Walton Avenues, was under the ownership and development of the prominent real estate family of William J. Lewis. Many structures constructed at the turn of the century remain intact today.


With the rise in the African American population in St. Louis during the early 1900s, the lack of housing became a pressing issue. In the 1940s, Black St. Louis residents, notably led by Robert and Fredda Witherspoon, challenged the restrictive covenant that prohibited African Americans from owning homes. This pivotal action sparked a wave of legal activism in St. Louis, culminating in the groundbreaking Supreme Court case Shelley v. Kraemer that invalidated restrictive covenants nationwide.

Recognized for its significant role in the civil rights movement, Lewis Place was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. This three-block street stands as the oldest African American street in St. Louis.

Adjacent to Lewis Place, Fountain Park shares a parallel historical narrative. Positioned directly north of the Central West End. it boasts a similar architectural style to its neighbor. However, Fountain Park has not received the same level of investment and maintenance.

The neighborhood derives its name from the central oval park within its boundaries. The well-preserved homes surrounding the park add to the charm and character of Fountain Park.



POPULATION CHANGE




Changes in Demographics

Between 2020 and 2021, there has been a notable increase in White and Black populations. The White American population rose from 140 in 2020 to 422 in 2021, while the Black or African American population surged from 422 in 2020 to 2,428 in 2021.

The data are being retrieved from U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates. Estimates of urban and rural populations, housing units, and characteristics reflect boundaries of urban areas defined based on Census 2010 data. As a result, data for urban and rural areas from ACS do not necessarily reflect the results of ongoing urbanization.


RACE AND ETHNICITY



Demographics of Fountain Park and Lewis Place

Fountain Park and Lewis Place has a diverse population, with White American comprising 50% of the total population, followed by Black or African American at 20%. The Asian community represents the smallest percentage of the population at 1%.


AGE BY SEX



Examining the Population of Fountain Park/Lewis Place

Both Fountain Park and Lewis Place show minimal population growth, especially in younger age categories. Notably, there is a higher number of elderly females and a higher median age for men in this area. The median age of residents in this region is 33.7 years.





Educational Attainment Comparison

ZONING MAP OF FOUNTAIN PARK & LEWIS PLACE NEIGHBORHOODS






The Work Habits

Job Categories in Fountain Park and Lewis Place

JOB GROWTH BY INCOME




Comparing Job Growth in 2020 and 2021


CRIME OVER THE PAST TEN YEARS



Analyzing Crime Statistics in Fountain Park/Lewis Place

Over the past decade, the crime rate has been steady at 300 incidents. A spike occurred in 2021, with a peak of 600 incidents in a year.

CRIME BY TYPE




Crime Statistics

According to official records, there have been 592 crime cases reported in the neighborhood. These incidents are related to property crimes, while society, unspecified and personal crimes make up 24%, 21%, and 16% of the total.



Analyzing Commuting Patterns in the Community

Of the 1,173 workers, a majority (56%) preferred to drive as their primary mode of transportation. Those who did not choose driving tended to rely on alternative modes of transportation, such as carpooling and public transit.

DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

Courtyard by Marriot

The proposed Courtyard by Marriot at the corner of Delmar and Kingshighway will have 100 rooms and 200 parking spaces. It will be smaller than most Marriott hotels, allowing for a more intimate atmosphere and personalized service.

Elevation Space

The Elevation Space at 4731 Delmar Blvd will contain 25,000 square feet of shared office space with tools to support entrepreneurship and investment in underserved communities.

Hodiamont Greenway

Great Rivers Greenway has proposed linking the St. Vincent Greenway with Midtown and the Brickline Greenway through a trail built along the former Hodiamont streetcar line. The Greenway will serve the West End-Visitation Park, Vandeventer, Lewis Place, Academy and Fountain Park communities.

Urban League Projects

The Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis has submitted over 20 building permits over the last year, including \$1.75M for a new greenhouse, issued July 2023, and various other projects, such as a new Simmons Bank.

Martin Luther King Day Celebration - January

 The day begins with a prayer gathering for peace at the MLK statue in Fountain Park. Then, attendees head across the street to Centennial Christian Church for an afternoon of music, talent, and workshops on voting, organizing, and empowerment.

Fountain Park Juneteenth - June

 The neighbors of Fountain Park and Centennial Church host an annual Juneteenth Community Awareness Celebration.
 Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration to commemorate the ending of slavery in the United States.

National Night Out - October

 NNO is a national community-building celebration to encourage neighborhoods to develop a relationship with their local police force. The event includes food, music, giveaways, and activities for all ages.

Ernestine Hill Children's Winter Wonderland - December

This Christmas party is held annually in honor of Mrs.
 Ernestine Hill, who served as committeewoman for the 18th
 Ward for over 30 years and held an annual party for the
 children of the community.

Fountain Park


In 1889 this fountain was donated to the Aubert Park neighborhood by the Merchants Exchange. As a result the subdivision was renamed Fountain Park.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Statue

The statue of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. serves as a focal point within the community.

The Lewis Place Gate

The Lewis Place Gate is distinguished by its classical Roman-style arch, stands as the entrance to the neighborhood, welcoming residents to the elegant homes within its confines.

Ranken Technical College

Ranken Technical College is a private technical school that offers programs automotive, electrical, construction, information technology, and manufacturing.
