THE GROVE / FOREST PARK SOUTHEAST

The Grove is a business and entertainment district located along Manchester Avenue in the Forest Park Southeast neighborhood of St. Louis city. Stretching nearly a mile from Kingshighway Boulevard to Vandeventer Avenue, almost 100 businesses call it home.


Over the past 60 years, the Grove has transitioned from a retail strip that supported the neighborhood's working-class population of the 1950s to a locale for the LGBTQ+ community. Currently, it hosts an eclectic mix of businesses, restaurants, retail stores, bars, clubs, and other entertainment venues.



YEARLY EVENTS



Children's Peace Parade

July

The Children's Peace Parade is organized by Midtown Community Services. Summer Academy Day Camp campers make signs, and the parade gives kids a voice and lets them know how important it is to speak their opinions respectfully and peacefully.

World Naked Bike Ride August

The ride promotes a positive body image, alternative forms of transportation, and cyclists' rights. Riders are encouraged to go "as bare as they dare." World Naked Bike Rides have occurred in over 20 countries, each year. The ride starts and ends in the Grove.



IndiHop

June

IndiHop combines two iconic strips in St. Louis, the Grove and Cherokee Street, for one event that celebrates beer. Local businesses host ticketed guests to sample offerings from independent breweries



Moonlight Ramble

August

The annual Moonlight Ramble is the "World's Original Nighttime Bike Ride." Held at midnight near the full moon in August, it attracts thousands of riders each year. The event includes a bike ride through the streets, a vendor area, entertainment, and an after-party with snacks and drinks.

GroveFest

October

For over 15 years, this festival has brought thousands of St. Louisans to the Grove. The street festival is a free event and packs a lot of fun into one day. GroveFest features local vendors, a family area, street performers, and main stage performances.

LANDMARKS

Oscar Waring House



Oscar Waring was the first African American principal of Sumner High School, the first public high school for African American students west of the Mississippi River. Waring was appointed principal in 1879 and remained until retiring in 1908. He was a gifted linguist who spoke fluent German, French, Spanish, and Italian.

The Mangrove Building

Renovated in 2004 by
Mangrove Development, The
Mangrove Building at 4628
Manchester Avenue was the
former home of Carp's
Department Store. It was also
home to Mangrove Cafe & Ice
Cream Shop, then the famous
Sweetie Pies, and now Grace
Meat + Three.

The St. Louis Wall of Fame



In 2011, Grace McCammond and students from the Herbert Hoover Boys & Girls Club painted the "St. Louis Wall of Fame." It includes the faces of famous St. Louis African Americans such as Maya Angelou, Chuck Berry, Nelly, and Miles Davis. The youth developed the concept and researched individuals to include. The mural, originally located at 4261 Manchester Avenue, have been relocated to 4243 Manchester Avenue.



COMMUNITY ASSETS

Family Care Health Center

The Family Care Health Center seeks to provide affordable and accessible healthcare to underserved communities and train a workforce to uplift the general care of the area.



Park Central Development Corporation

PCD has many responsibilities, including the administration of Special Taxing Districts (The Grove Community Improvement District in FPSE), leading neighborhood planning and development review (Form-Based Code, FPSE Development Review Committee), and Anti-Displacement and Stay in Place programming (minor home repair, small business grants, snow removal & grass cutting, etc.) It also manages neighborhood marketing and events.

The Grove Community Improvement District

The Grove CID was established in 2009 to provide additional services, infrastructure support, and marketing for the Grove. It is financed primarily by a 1% sales tax and an annual special assessment.
