Note from Executive Director

This year's Holiday Outreach Program was a huge success despite a host of challenges presented by the current Covid-19 pandemic. In an effort to meet the needs of our program participants during these unprecedented times, we partnered with our local community development corporation, Park Central Development, to provide them with a host of expanded services and assistance. The results were nothing short of spectacular.

This year's program provided utility and gift assistance to 80 families and individuals, holiday food baskets and personal protective equipment to over 100 seniors, and 50 holiday baskets to area families. Our partner Park Central Development also used this opportunity to identify families in need of rental and mortgage assistance, as well as conducted a comprehensive family needs assessment to connect struggling families with area resources. We raised a record amount of funding, the vast majority coming from our generous departments and employees at Washington University School of Medicine as well as programmatic contributions from Park Central.

We are extremely grateful to the medical school departments and 719 individual donors to the program this year. Because of their participation, many area families were able to celebrate this year's holiday season with food and gifts, while continuing to maintain their households during these trying times. We are extremely grateful to our community partner Park Central for providing the wrap-around services that connected our participating families and individuals with the critical resources needed during these challenging times.

We are already preparing and looking forward to next year's program and hope that we can build on the success we experienced this year. Happy

The Holiday Outreach Program is an annual community initiative administered by the Washington University Medical Center Redevelopment Corporation (WUMCRC). Our mission through this program is to aid in stabilizing the neighborhoods surrounding the Washington University medical campus.

This year, in partnership with Park Central

Development and with the help of generous donors and sponsors, we were able to provide utility and grocery assistance to local families and elderly neighborhood residents.







Participating departments of the Washington University School of Medicine and BJC HealthCare were matched with individuals in order to provide assistance with utility payments, providing grocery store gift cards, or other potential items from their wishlist.

- **\$4,846** used to pay outstanding utility bills for families to Ameren and Spire.
- **\$39,851** in gift cards given to families in need via Target, WalMart, and Visa.
- **\$9,420** in gift cards given to elderly individuals in need via Target and Visa.
- **\$2,940** used to purchase Holiday Baskets to families and seniors in need.

Park Central Development contributed over \$10,000 toward the purchase of Holiday Baskets for families and seniors.







171 Holiday Gift Baskets were delivered to elderly individuals living in housing facilities.

50 Holiday Gift Baskets were delivered to local families in need.

In total, we were able to serve **80 local families and 171 seniors** this holiday season.

Food baskets contained ingredients to cook a holiday meal, snacks, and sanitary items for the winter.
